

Prayer Walk Around Your Neighborhood

“But, for me and my house, we will serve the Lord.” Joshua 24:15 ESV

Prayer Tips

- Pray with your family or with friends/neighbors. You can prayer walk alone, but many find their prayers are more focused when expressed with someone else.
 - Pray audibly for clarity and agreement.
 - As you finish, discuss – or even write down – the prayers, people, and places of most importance. You’ll be ready for the next round of on-site prayer.
 - Invite the Spirit of God to accompany you, guiding your steps and your words.
 - Be attentive during moments of silence, allowing the Holy Spirit to help you see with His eyes and pray in accordance with His heart.
 - Read Scripture aloud. God breathed it and loves to bless it.

Walk around your own neighborhood praying over specific areas, streets, and homes.

Consider areas to prayer walk:

- Walk specific streets where you know the names of friends and/or unchurched neighbors.
 - Prayer walk over public play spaces.
 - Pray over the pool area/pool house/community buildings.

Pray as specifically as possible as God makes you aware of your surroundings.

- If you see signs of children in the house, pray for those children to grow up knowing God. Pray for the parents to have wisdom and patience in their job of parenting.
- If you see signs of teenagers at the house, pray for safety as those kids begin to stretch their wings. Pray they will find a sure path and stay well-grounded as they grow and leave the house.
- If you see a ‘for sale’ sign in the yard, pray for a smooth transition and move for the family and the new neighbors who will move in. Pray that the Christian neighbors in their new neighborhood will engage them with gospel conversations.”
- If you see adults out for a run or walk, pray for the Lord to reveal Himself to that individual.
- In public areas, pray believers would have opportunities in those spaces to connect with other neighbors and to have gospel conversations.
- Recognize the beauty you encounter on your prayer walk: flowers, landscaping, wildlife. Ask the Lord to use His creation to make your neighbors more aware of His goodness.
- Pray for other believers you know in your neighborhood to have opportunities to have gospel conversations with their neighbors.
